Sub: Extension of Provisional Affiliation to the above said school (Affiliation No.1930626) beyond 31.03.2018-reg.

Sir/Madam.

This is with reference to your online application registered on 29/06/2017, on the above subject.

In this connection, I am directed to convey the sanction for extension of provisional affiliation of the school with the Board for its Secondary School Examination for a further period of five years w.e.f. 01.04.2018 to 31.03.2023 subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions:-

The School is required to abide itself by the Examination/Affiliation-Bye-Laws of the Board.

The School is required to apply on online for further extension of affiliation along with the requisite
fee and other documents by 30th June of the preceding year in which the Provisional Affiliation
expires as per Rule 15.11 of Affiliation Bye Laws.

3. The school will follow the syllabus on the basis of curriculum prescribed by NCERT/CBSE and text books publishing by NCERT/CBSE for the Middle Classes. The school will follow syllabus and courses as per scheme of studies prescribed by the Board for Secondary/Sr. Secondary School Examination and changes made therein from time to time.

4. The school will follow the RTE Act, 2009 and instructions issued thereon by the CBSE/Respective

State /UT Govt from time to time.

 The school will enroll students proportionate to the facilities available in the school as prescribed in the Affiliation Bye-Laws of the Board which shall not in general exceed the optimum number as under from Pre-Primary to Class XII:-

(d) School running on bigger campus of more than 02 acres, the number of students shall be restricted as per the actual facilities in the school which shall be proportionate to the optimum number mentioned at (a), (b) and (c) above.

(e) Schools running on less than 01 acre campus shall restrict number of students as follows:-

6. The school should scrupulously observe prescription from the Municipal Authority/District Collectorate/Transport Department regarding drinking water, fire safety and transport precautions in the school. A certificate from the Municipal/Fire/transport Authority regarding sanitary conditions, water/fire/transport safety should be submitted every five years as per Rule 8.5 of Affiliation Bye Laws and shall follow Rule no. 3.3(vii) and Rule 23(xi) in this regard.

7. The school will provide well equipped Laboratories, Library and other facilities as per norms of the Board. The relevant books to the academic level of students to be made available in the library and would keep at least 05 books per student subject to a minimum of 1500 books excluding text books.

 The school will also abide itself by the conditions of affiliation already prescribed by the State Government concerned.

 As per Affiliation Bye-laws the optimum strength of a section should not exceed more than 40 students.

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- 10. School should have at least one adequately equipped computer lab with a minimum of 10 computers and would ensure computer student ratio of 1:20 at least. Proper software along with facility of Broad Band connectivity with the feature of 'internet always on' from any service provider to be ensured.
- 11. The section teacher ratio of 1:1.5 is to be maintained to teach various subjects and school shall appoint qualified and trained teaching staff on regular basis as per provisions of Affiliation Bye Laws of the Board.
- 12. The school and its records shall be open for inspection by an officer/official of the Board or an authorized representative of the Board/State Educational Department at any time and the school shall furnish information as may be asked for by the Board/State Government from time to time.

 Income & Expenditure and audited annual accounts statement duly certified by the Chartered Accountant for the current year is required to be sent and the same be submitted every year.

- 14. Fees should normally be charged under the heads prescribed by the Department of Education of the State/U.T. for schools of different categories. No capitation fee or voluntary donations for gaining admission in the school or for any other purpose should be charged / collected in the name of the school and the school should not subject the child or his or her parents or guardians to any screening procedure in accordance with Rule No. 11.1, 2 & 3. Also, as per Chapter II, Rule No. 11.1 of Affiliation Bye-Laws, fees charges should be commensurate with the facilities provided by the institution.
- 15. The school should not engage incommercialization activities:
 - a) As per rule no. 19.1 (ii) It shall ensure that the school is run as a community service and not as a business and that commercialization does not take place in the school in any shape whatsoever.
 - b) As per rule no. 19.1 (ii)a Any franchisee school making payment on account of use of name, motto and logo of franchiser institution or any other non-academic activities would be termed as commercialization of institution and to provide an affidavit that the school/society has not entered into any such contract to use Name, logo, motto for consideration of fee.
- Teachers are to be made educated regarding corporal punishment should avoid any type of such involvement i.a.w. rule no. 44.1 (d. & e).
- School will not prepare any student/ start class for any other Board except CBSE from their CBSE affiliated school building/ premises.
- Admission to the school is to be made restricted under rule 6.1 of Examination bye laws and rule
 12 (i, ii & iii) of Affiliation bye laws.
- 19. The school has to constitute a committee for protection of woman from sexual harassment at the work place and to abide by the guidelines and norms prescribed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in W.P. Criminal No 666-70 of 1992 Vishaskha and other State of Rajasthan and other delivered on 13.8.1997 mentioned under rule no. 10.9.
- 20. Each school affiliated/ to be affiliated with the Board shall frame Service Rules for its employees which will be as per Education Act of the state/U.T., if the Act makes adoption of the same obligatory, otherwise as per Service Rules given in Affiliation Bye Laws. Further, Service contract will be entered with each employee as per the provisions in the Education Act of the state/ U.T., or as given in Appendix III, if not obligatory as per the State Education Act.
- 21. Pay and allowances to staff should be revised time to time to bring it at par with that to State Government/Govt. of India. Further, Salary and Service conditions of staff should be provided in accordance with Rule no. 3.3 (v) and Rule no. 10.2 as appended below-
- a. The school in India must pay salaries and admissible allowances to the staff not less than the corresponding categories of employees in the State Government schools or as per scales etc. prescribed by the Government of India." Further, the service conditions as per Rule 10 and Rules 24 to 49 of Affiliation Bye-Laws also be adhered to.
- Salary should be paid through Electronic Clearing Service (ECS) from the date of first appointment of the teachers on probation.

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As per Rule 13.3 and 13.3 (i), the school shall supply information and returns called for by the 22 Board/State/ Central Government/Local Authority within the prescribed time given for its furnishing to the authority concerned and the school should prepare its annual report containing comprehensive information including name, postal address and e-mail, telephone numbers, affiliation status, period of provisional affiliation, details of infrastructures, details of teachers, number of students and status of fulfillment of norms of affiliation Bye-Laws and upload the same on the website before 15th September of every year. As per rule no. 8.8 (iv & v), every affiliated school to develop their own website containing comprehensive information such as affiliation status, details of infrastructure, details of teachers, number of students, postal address and e-mail, telephone number etc.

Continuous sponsoring of students at Board examination is to be made as per rule 13.12 23. (iv), Failure to do so will lead to suo moto withdrawal of the affiliation of the school for

Secondary and Senior Secondary Examination as the case may be.

24 As per rule 13.12 (ii), no affillated school shall endeavour to present the candidates who are not on its roll nor shall it present the candidates of its unaffiliated Branch/School to any of the Board's Examinations. 25.

Running of classes of coaching institutions in the school premises in the pretext of providing coaching to the students for various examinations is not approved by the board. Strict action would be taken on defaulters.

As per rule no. 8.2 and 13.11, facilities for physically challenged student should be adequately 26. provided and every school shall promote inclusion of student with disabilities/special needs in the normal school as per provisions of the 'Persons with Disabilities Act 1995' 27.

School infrastructure and teachers for examinations conducted by the board and evaluation

of answer scripts should be made available as per rule no. 13.4.

As per rule no. 3.3 h (vi), every school should organize at least one week training programme 28. for teachers every year in association with any teachers training institute recognized by the State or Central Government or by any agency identified by the Board. 29

Every secondary and senior secondary school shall appoint a person on full time basis for

performing the duties of a Health Wellness teacher as per rule 53.5.

- Strict adherence to the provisions of Wild Life Protection Act while procuring plants and 30 animals for the use in laboratories by the school must be made i.a.w. circular no 03 dated 21 31.
- As per rule 15.1 (d), the school will follow the syllabus on the basis of curriculum prescribed by NCERT/ CBSE and text books published by NCERT/CBSE for the Middle classes as far as practicable or exercise extreme care while selecting books of private publishers. The contents must be scrutiny to preclude any objectionable content that hurts the feelings of any class, community, gender, religious group in society. If prescribed books found having such content, the school will have to take responsibility of such content. Provided that the school would put a list of such books prescribed by it on its website with the written declaration duly signed by the Manager and the principal to the effect that they have gone through the contents of the books prescribed by the school and own the responsibility. 32.

As per RTE act 2009 and Chapter IX rule No. 53.2.2(a) and 53.3, a teacher appointed to teach Class I to V and VI to VIII should pass in the Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET)/ State Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) conducted by the appropriate Government in accordance with the guidelines

framed by the NCTE for the purpose.

5-6 names of persons not below the rank of Principal of Sr. Secondary School affiliated with the 33. Board be recommended so that two of them may be approved by the Board as its nominee in the School Managing Committee (Of these 2-3 may be Principal of KV/JNV). 34

The school will create Reserve Fund as per the requirement of the Affiliation Bye Laws.

It is mandatory for every affiliated school to become a member in the local Sahodaya of CBSE 35.

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36. The Board would not allow any transfer of property/sale of school by one society/ Management/ Trust to another Society/Management/Trust through agreement/sale deed and the school shall not be closed down in the same premises. In case such transaction is effected explicitly or implicitly the Board shall withdraw its affiliation with immediate effect.

37. The school should keep a copy of Affiliation/ Examination Bye Laws for reference purpose and also advised to visit CBSE websites www.cbseaff.nic.in&www.cbse.nic.in for updates.

38. In case of established violation of the provisions contained in Affiliation/Examination Bye laws of the Board, the school shall be liable for disaffiliation as per Rule No. 17 of Affiliation Bye-laws.

 The School shall enter into an agreement with the Board detailing the terms and conditions for grant of affiliation, which will be binding on both the parties.

 The school must follow Uniform System of Assessment, Examination and Report Card for Classes VI-IX from Academic Year 2017-18 onwards as per the Board's Circular No.: Acad-14/2017, dated 21.03.2017.

- 41. The school must submit its information through Online Affiliated School Information System (OASIS) as per the Board's Circular No.:CBSE/Aff./4/Circular/2016, dated 10.11.2016, within 30 days from the receipt of this grant letter. Link for OASIS is available on Board's website: www.cbse.nic.in
- The School is required to appoint Special Educator as per Rule 13(11) of Affiliation Bye-Laws of the Board and as mentioned in Board's Circular dated 25.06.2015.

43. The school is required to follow the safety guidelines as issued by the Board vide Circular No-19/2017 dated 12.09.2017 captioned "Safety of Children in School"

44. It is observed that the school has submitted No Objection Certificate at the time of Secondary level affiliation. The school is also required to submit Recognition Certificate as per section 18 of Right to Education Act, 2009. The school is directed to apply for Recognition Certificate immediately and submit the same to the Board within a period of one year on issuance of grant letter.

45. The school is required to submit Recognition Certificate as per the Section 18 of Right to Education Act, 2009. If the same has not been obtained earlier, School is directed to apply for recognition certificate immediately and submit the same to CBSE office within a period of one year on issuance of this grant letter. It must also be noted that further extension of Provisional Affiliation and Upgradation will not be considered without valid Recognition Certificate"

46. The school is abide with the Board's vide Circular dated 18/12/2017 and 23/02/2018, had issued instructions to its all affiliated schools for nomination of teachers for the purpose of evaluation of AISSE & AISSSE, 2019 failing which this will be considered as violation to the Rule No. 13.4 and Circular dated 18/12/2017 & 23/02/2018. The instructions may be followed strictly in future.

In the reference cited 1st, the school was granted No Objection Certificate for its affiliation of Secondary Syllabus with the Central Board of Secondary Education.

2. In the reference cited 2nd, under the provisions of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009, Sec 18, read as follows:-

"No School, other than a school established, owned or controlled by the appropriate Government or the local authority, shall, after the commencement of this Act, be established or function, without obtaining a certificate of recognition from such authority, by making an application in such form and manner, as may be prescribed."

3. In the reference cited 3rd, the Government issued G.O vide G.O.(Ms) No.144, School Education (GE) Department dated 18.09.2014 making it mandatory for Schools affiliated to boards other than Secondary / Higher Secondary Boards of the State Government to get necessary recognition from the Director of School Education.

With reference to your application dated:- 19 04.2021 and School Inspection in this regard, I hereby convey the grant of recognition to the VEDANTA ACADEMY, No.2/142, Unjapalayam, Kuppandampalayam Post, Avinashi Taluk, Tirupur District - 641 654 (Survey No.19/1B, 1B2, 2B2, 3B, 4A, 20/2 & 20/2A) for Classes LKG to X Std for the period from 01.06.2020 to 31.05.2023

A. The recognition Code Number allotted to your school- 004-10-S-0051-0523

The above recognition is subject to the following conditions:-

(1) The temporary recognition accorded to the school is valid upto 31.05.2023 and is to be renewed at an interval of every three years.

- (2) The grant of recognition is not extendable and does not in any way imply any obligation to recognize-beyond class XII.
- (3) The School shall abide by the provisions of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 and the Tamil Nadu Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2011.
- (4) The School shall admit in pre-school / class I to the extent of 25% of the strength in each class, children belonging to Weaker Section and Disadvantaged Group in the neighborhood and provide free and compulsory elementary education till its completion.
- (5) The School shall maintain a separate bank account for the purpose of reimbursement.
- (6) The School shall not collect any capitation fee and subject the child or his or her parent or guardian to any screening procedure.
- (7) The School shall not deny admission to any child, -
 - (a) For lack of age proof if such admission is sought subsequent to the extended period prescribed for admission.
 - (b) On the ground of religion, caste or race, place of birth or any of them.
- (8) The School shall ensure that,-
 - no child admitted shall be held back in any class or expelled from School till the completion of elementary education in a school;
 - (ii) no child shall be subjected to physical punishment or mental harassment.
 - (iii) no child is required to pass any board examination till the completion of elementary education;
 - (iv) every child completing elementary education shall be awarded a certificate as laid down under rule 21.
 - inclusion of students with disabilities / special needs as per provision of the Act.
 - (vi) the teachers are recruited with minimum qualifications as laid under section 23(1) of the Act:
 - Provided that the teachers who, at the commencement of this Act do not possess minimum qualifications shall acquire such minimum qualifications within a period of 5 years;
 - (vii) the teacher performs his duties specified under sub-section (1) of section 24 of the Act; and
 - (viii) the teacher shall not engage himself for private teaching activities.
- (9) The School shall follow the basic requirements and syllabus on the basis of curriculum laid down by Appropriate authority.
- (10) The School shall maintain the standards and norms as specified in section 19 of the Act
- (11) No unrecognized classes shall run within the premises of the school or outside in the name of School.
- (12) The School building or other structures and the grounds are used only for the purposes of education and skill development.

- (13) The School is run by a society registered under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act, 1975 (Tamil Nadu Act 27 of 1975), or a public trust constituted under any law for the time being in force;
- (14) The School is not run for profit to any individual, group or association of individuals or any other persons;
- (15) The accounts should be audited and certified by a Chartered Accountant and proper accounts statements should be prepared. A copy each of the Statements of Accounts should be sent every year to the competent Authority granting recognition.
- (16) The recognition Code Number shall be quoted for any correspondence with the competent authority.
- (17) The School shall furnish such reports and information as may be required by the competent authority from time to time and shall comply with such instructions of the State Government or the competent authority as may be issued to secure the continued fulfillment of the condition of recognition or the removal of deficiencies in working of the School;

B.(1)Tamil shall be taught as a subject from in Standards I to IX in all schools notified under sub clause (iv) of clause (e) of section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Tamil Learning Act, 2006 (Tamil Nadu Act 13 of 2006) in a phased manner commencing from the Academic year 2015-2016 for standard I, from the academic year 2016-2017 for standard I and II and shall be extended up to standard IX in a like manner as ordered in a reference (4) cited.
